2. **Preferred Name and Gender.** Cadets who identify with a name or gender which does not match with what is on their birth certificate can request to have it changed in their personal records at cadets. This could include the use of a name which is not your first name (eg, Bob instead of Robert or the use of your middle name instead of your first name) or could reflect the use of non-binary genders (eg, use of they/them vice he/she or the use of pronouns which reflect other than sex assigned at birth). If you wish to make a change, please let your divisional officer know.

3. **Supply Information.** Supply is open each training night. Cadets should report to supply if they need to exchange uniform parts or if they are missing parts of their uniform. For new cadets, the Supply Officer will begin to size and issue uniforms in the coming weeks.
